

Rebecca Kelly Ballet—Early Years in NYC

Charlie Chaplin was the inspiration à^@, åÁballets and busking events! The solo, "**Charles**," choreographed to Chopin c@^^Áwaltzes, was also influenced by Kelly's early years with modern dance pioneer Charles Weidman. These early theatrical works were performed between 1975 and 1984 in Manhattan (and on tour with the Vanaver Caravan.)

"Mignonne," set to music by Chopin and Bach, was a tale of unrequited love told through the character of the Little Tramp who gets a job as a stage hand. Created in 1980 in collaboration with cellist, Abby Newton as Mignonne, "the beautiful concert artist," and dancer Craig Brashear as "the boss," originally performed at Appleby Studio Theater in SoHo in 1978, and Dance Theater Workshop, in NYC. The whimsical "broom dance" was performed on many occasions.
